

Who provides your ambulance service when you need it?

Canaan Ambulance.

Who is Canaan Ambulance?

It is a group of 26 <u>paid, trained, licensed volunteers</u> who give their time to make sure there is always coverage when someone needs emergency care.

What's a Paid Volunteer?

Local community members <u>volunteer their time</u> to be trained as first responders and who provide emrgency medical care and transport to a hospital. They <u>receive a nominal amount</u> to be available for emergency calls (\$6 per hour) and a slightly greater amount for the actual emergency calls (\$15 to \$25 per hour for a call that typically lasts an hour or two).

Who owns or controls Canaan Ambulance?

Technically, Canaan Ambulance is part of the Town of Canaan but it is managed by the providers themselves. All funds pass through the Town and are accounted for and audited by the Town but funds are dedicated to Canaan Ambulance. The Towns of Dorchester, Orange and Grafton partner with Canaan Ambulance.

What does it cost annually to provide this service?

About \$376,000.

Why does it cost \$376,000 a year? Sounds expensive.

Think about the time and materials needed. It requires 2 people available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year including all holidays. That is <u>17,520 hours a year</u> or the equivalent of about 8 full time employees. That does not count the extra hours needed when two or three ambulance teams are needed. At just an average of \$14 per hour, that equals \$245,280 a year. Required payroll benefits and taxes add another \$30,000. Regional Paramedics add \$9,000.

There are the three ambulances that have to be replaced periodically, fueled, maintained and insured at an annual cost of \$53,000.

The cost of training, insurance and medical supplies totals \$31,000.



How many calls are there and what's the cost per call?

The 400 calls a year average about <u>\$940 a call just to send an ambulance out!</u> We know that the life of a family member or neighbor is worth much more.

Who pays for all this?

<u>\$166,000 of the cost comes from the taxpayers</u> of Canaan, Dorchester, Grafton and Orange. Canaan pays \$126,000 of this amount. Insurance and individuals are billed and pay about <u>\$135,000</u> in payments. <u>Special events raise</u> <u>about \$35,000</u>.

We have covered \$336,000. That leaves about \$40,000 that is not funded.
